

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Kansas Establishments by Number of Employees¹

The Bureau of Labor Statistics provides data on the number of establishments in the state, grouped by the number of employees in each establishment.² In the State of Kansas the largest number of establishments by group, are small establishments with fewer than 20 employees. Mid-size establishments, with 20 to 249 employees, employ the highest number of people and pay the most in total wages.

Establishments by size, as a percent of total establishments, are very stable. From 2003 to 2013, businesses with fewer than five employees accounted for an average of 58.1 percent of total establishments. The largest employers, on average, accounted for 2.1 percent of total establishments. These percentages are the same as the averages for 2001 to 2011.





Although establishment size, as a percent of total establishments, is stable, the total number of establishments in any given size category does vary from year to year. There is less volatility in the total number of establishments with fewer employees, than for employers with more than 250 workers. Over the 10-year period from 2003 to 2013, the number of smaller establishments varied an average of 0.4 percent from any given year to another; whereas, establishments with more than 250 employees experienced two-digit percentage changes, year over year, eight times during that time period, with the largest decrease in the number of establishments being 18.6 percent in the first quarter of 2009, and the largest increase being 18.9 percent in the first quarter of 2011.


As a percent of total employment, mid-sized employers account for the most significant portion of Kansas employment. Establishments with 20 to 249 employees, on average, employed 47 percent of total employment. Establishments with 19 or fewer employees accounted for 28 percent of total employment, while businesses with more than 250 employees averaged 25 percent of total employment. Compared to the 2001 to 2011 percentages, the average number of employees in the largest establishments declined approximately 0.4 percent, while mid-sized establishments gained 0.3 percent, and the smallest establishments gained 0.1 percent.





The larger the establishments, the more fluctuations in employment levels over time. The category showing the most variation in employment levels is establishments with more than 1,000 employees;

this is closely followed by those with 500 to 999 employees and those with 100 to 249 employees. The two categories with fewer than 10 employees show the least variability.



The estimated average annual wage per employee is higher in larger establishments than smaller. All categories with 250 employees or more have a higher average annual wage per employee than the average for all establishments. This was also true for the years 2001 to 2011. The average annual wage of \$37,557 in 2003 to 2013 was 6.2 percent higher than the 2001 to 2011 annual average wage.
